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UNIT: I ACTION TAKEN REPORT

01/22 BoG_Oct-19 Presentation and action taken report by the Director, IST, JNTUH after 21st BoG Meeting dated 03-08-2019.

Director, Institute of Science and Technology shall brief about the activities related to the institute in general and TEQIP-III activities in particular. This will enable the honorable Chairman and members of BoG to provide suggestions and to take appropriate decisions.

The Action taken report is as follows:

Performance Audit Status: Performance auditing of IST was conducted during 22-24 July, 2019 by Performance Auditor Dr. K. A. Radha Krishna Rao Professor & Head, Department of ECE, P.E.S. College of Engineering, Mandya. IST has scored 1.23 as performance score, in the performance audit report of the institution as shown in Annexure-I.

Institute of Science and Technology is recognized as one of the high performing Institution by NPIU and has received 10% of the PLA as additional grant. The allocation of the fund under different heads is as per the NPIU recommendations i.e., 50% towards procurement of goods, 40% towards academic process and 10% toward IOC. In this connection IST is proposing to spend Rs.35 lakhs towards procurement, Rs. 28 lakhs towards academic processes and Rs.07 lakhs towards IOC.

❖ Procurement of Goods:

Out of the total allocated budget of Rs.385 lakhs (350+35 lakhs as additional grant), an amount of Rs. 350.17 lakhs has been incurred towards procurement of goods / items under the head of Procurement. The expenditure in pipeline is Rs. 3.25 lakhs and Balance amount is Rs.31.58 lakhs.

❖ Academic Processes:

As per the NPIU, PIP, Number of activities under academic processes were listed and include:

- ✓ improvement in teaching learning, and research competence, (faculty staff training, enhancing knowledge and research competence, management development training of faculty members, subject area training programs, training of technical staff)
- ✓ Enhancement of research , development and innovation
- ✓ Improving transition rates, of all the students
- ✓ Instituting academic and non academic reforms
- Student Employability: increasing interaction with industry, student career counseling placement.
- ✓ Increasing faculty productivity and Motivation and Twinning activities.

Institute of Science and Technology, JNTUH has been selected by NPIU as one of the best performing institute. NPIU has provided additional grant of 10% (Rs.70 Lakhs) to the institution (50% for procurement, 40% for Academic Process & 10% for IOC). Hence as per the norms, additional grant of 50% (Rs.35 lakhs) has been allocated under the head of procurement. To Consider and approve the estimated expenditure from the head of IOC towards Minor repairs and EMF.

Under the IOC, minor repair works may be taken up for improving the laboratories. All the TEQIP-III centres of IST have listed few repairs for smooth functioning of laboratories. Under the IOC head we have an amount of Rs.77 lakhs (including additional grant).

As on date we have incurred an amount of Rs.35.00 lakhs. We have estimated the expenditure under IOC as Rs.19.00 for the remaining project period. The total expenditure will be approximately under IOC will be Rs.54 lakhs. Therefore, we will be having a balance of 23 lakhs out of which, permission may be given to utilize Rs.12 lakhs for repairs of equipment at the centres. List enclosed as **Annexure-V**.

CII-GBC has submitted energy audit/water audit for the IST under Environmental Management Framework (EMF) (copy enclosed as **Annexure-VI)**. Upon the recommendations of CII-GBC, and as per the EMF activity plan of IST, Director has identified few works under EMF to be taken up. An amount of Rs.11 lakhs may be permitted to spend towards EMF, as EMF is one of the performance bench mark. Proposed works under EMF are enclosed as **Annexure-VII**.

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IST is issuing nearly 300 ID cards for the newly joined students, scholars and staff. Each ID card printing cost is more than Rs.100/- in the open market and nearly IST is spending Rs.30,000/- per year. Moreover they are printing only in bulk and IST could not get ID card in between whenever the new scholar or new staff member joins. Recently we came to know that ID card printing machine is costing around Rs.70,000/- and other consumables are costing around Rs.5,000/- per 1000 cards.

Therefore it is opined to have ID card printing machine at IST with some consumables so that within 2 years the entire establishment cost can be recovered and there after we save at least Rs.25,000/- per year and we can provide the ID cards as and when required. Hence, we have requested the Honorable chairperson of the BoG by email dated: 29/08/2019 for in-principle approval for procuring the ID card printing machine for the IST with consumables at an estimated cost of Rs.75,000/- under the head of procurement of goods from TEQIP-III funds of IST.

The chairman of the BoG has accorded in-principle approval. Accordingly the Director has procured the said machine as per NPIU norms.
